

Rural Food Drive

2020 Ukrainian Canadian Congress Alberta Provincial Council took the leadership to host two Food Bank Drive (April 11 and May 9, 2020) for rural communities in Alberta to help support during the COVID19 pandemic. The Edmonton Ukrainian community organizations and individuals came out very strong and raised almost \$6 000 in support of rural Alberta food banks! This generosity inspired local communities to raise an additional \$2 500. With help from local Ukrainian organizations and many humble individuals, UCC-APC gathered and delivered almost 2 000 kg of food!

UCC-APC organized the first food drive for the Lamont County Food Bank and food support office in the Town of Bruderheim. This success resulted in the 600 kg donation of food items to the local offices. UCC-APC donated \$500 to the Town of Two Hills' society that provided grocery vouchers to those who are in need of assistance.

The second food drive supported the needs of the food banks in Vegreville, Smoky Lake, St. Paul and Edmonton. This tremendous contribution to the towns was welcomed with joy and excitement. With the support and encouragement from UCC-APC, each town organized its own food drive initiative. Vegreville food drive was led by UCC-APC board member

and Vegreville Academy of Ukrainian Dance. Their local Food Bank was overwhelmed with the food donation of 900 kg and monetary contributions from the residents of over \$1 000! Edmonton Food Bank received close to 300 kg of food and a \$1 000 donation from UCC-APC member-organization Edmonton Catholic Schools Ukrainian Bilingual Parent Advisory Society (UBPAS). Smoky Lake food drive was supported by Holubka Dancers and resulted in about 350 kg food donation! St. Paul's food drive initiative was spearheaded by the local Ukrainian leader Amil Shapka. He encouraged other Ukrainian organizations to support their effort. Altogether St. Paul Food Bank received close to 400 kg of food and a monetary donation of \$1 250.

UCC-APC is forever grateful for the support of every individual who came out on April 11th and May 9th to show their support and care for the rural Alberta towns that hold such deep Ukrainian roots.

From June 1st to June 20th, 2020, UCC-APC commemorated the centenary anniversary of the end of Ukrainian Canadian internment.

This tribute of informational and poetic videos and written work posted over social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, UCC-ACP website and printed newsletter demonstrated the stories of victims and their families. Their lives' events are exhibited through the works of artists, researchers, historians, politicians, and others who have continued to stress the importance of acknowledgment of the WWI Internment Operations in Canada.

The UCC-APC social media campaign far exceeded the goal of community engagement. Internment 100 posts reached over 205,000 people. Big success was attributed to the professionalism and dedication of the Committee that put together well-researched information. Our project contributors made the videos more engaging and diverse. With information being indefinitely available on the UCC-APC website, Facebook and YouTube, individuals will keep discovering the details of this historic tragedy.

COVID19 Community Outreach

Summer 2020

UCC-APC delivered Canada Day Care Packages to seniors in Alberta's rural communities, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. MLA Jackie Armstrong-Homeniuk informed UCC-APC of various grants designed

to support communities throughout Alberta during these unprecedented times. UCC-APC was successful with a grant from Family and Community Support Service with the City of Edmonton.

With our grant funds received we supported different demographic groups.140 packages were distributed to independent care lodges in the towns of Andrew, Chipman, Bruderheim, Lamont, and Mundare. The Canada Day Care Packages contained cloth face masks, a bilingual information sheet which simplified face mask protocols, hand sanitizer, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, lip balm, tissues, tea, Canada Day crossword puzzle, pencil and greeting card. We had the opportunity to give care packages to the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate. The Sisters have supported the Ukrainian immigrant community by providing a hospital, an orphanage, as well as care to those in need. It was our chance to show that we appreciate their contribution and are thinking of them! In speaking with the staff, we learned how the pandemic has impacted the lives of the seniors. In these uncertain times, they have found joy in the little things.

We prepared 200 children's creative kits – that included various items to stay engaged (pencils, paints, paper, seed paper, balloons, yarn and threads, colouring sheet and activity sheet, word search, bubbles, and candy. The kits went to the food banks in Lamont, Manville, St. Paul and Vegreville community organizations.

Fall 2020

UCC-APC secured a Government of Canada Community Emergency Response grant from Red Cross to complete another community outreach project for various demographic groups. We will be delivering 300 more seniors' hygiene kits, 300 children's creative boxes and a series of skills development webinars for adults. The webinars focus on developing or honing digital skills during pandemic with hope to secure employment. The topics span from computer, MS Office and Google Suite use to presentations from different colleges on post-secondary options and labour laws in Alberta. The grant also included \$6 000 projects for UBPAS and Ridna Shkola/Kursy to purchase reusable masks and other PPEs for children.

Ukrainian Days Festival 2020

Our Festival spanned over 9 days bringing together many people in showcasing all things Ukrainian in Alberta. Over 203 000 people were reached during our festival, with 58 000 watching full length videos and 10 000 engagements (Engaged Users: The number of unique people who engaged in certain ways with a post, for example by commenting on, liking or sharing). Over 130 people presented or were presented



during the festival. We tried to include many of our member-organizations during this festival. Special member-spotlight videos featured a short clip about each organization. We are happy to engage with the community during the busy summer months.

Some of the highlights of the program were:

- *ART* exclusive interviews with artists (pottery, traditional jewelry, embroidery) and an original paint night masterclass.
- *PERFORMANCE* masterclasses of different styles of Ukrainian dance and a live feature of solo dance performances; international Ukrainian hour; exclusive performance of Ukrainian band Shpyliasti Kobzari and musical performances from the groups across the province.

COOKING – a masterclass led by a renowned

local Ukrainian baker Natalia Shevchenko with a live Q&A session; various tutorials for Ukrainian cooking.

- ROOTS a unique series featuring the art of homesteading (covering foraging, beekeeping, ironsmith); original videos and interviews with outstanding Ukrainian individuals in Alberta and 15 memberorganizations videos! Three interactive children's storytelling videos with Ed Stelmach, Oleksandr Danyleiko and Olia Myc.
- ДЕНЬ НЕЗАЛЕЖНОСТІ videos about Ukraine's independence, local vocal and musical talents performing modern content.

Full digital content is available on our website <u>https://uccab.ca/uadays-2020-online/</u>. UCC-APC was able to raise funds through sponsorship and advertisement. We will continue to use the videos created during Ukrainian Days as they will remain relevant for many years.

UCAMA Project: Save The Archives and Collections

In response to the released news (June 2020) by the Ukrainian Canadian Archives and Museum's (UCAMA), that its assets are now in the possession of UMC Financial Management Inc. and are at risk of going to auction, the Ukrainian Canadian Congress - Alberta Provincial Council established an ad-hoc committee

for the purpose of saving the UCAMA archives and artifacts. We believed that these items were donated to UCAMA in good faith for the preservation of the history of the Ukrainian Canadian community in Alberta, and that they should remain within the community.

We are grateful for all donations from organizations and individuals who believed in the success of this project. In addition, UCC-APC's commitment was for the archives and collections to be completely dismantled and the project to end October 30th, 2020. We are happy to report that the project is now 75% complete. The artifacts will remain in the community museums and will be accessible to everyone.

Ukrainian-Canadian Heritage Day

On September 7, 1891, two adventurers from present-day Western Ukraine disembarked at Halifax, Nova Scotia onto Canadian soil, which set off the officially recorded presence of people of Ukrainian descent in Canada. They were looking for a better life that was being advertised by pro-Canadian interests throughout Europe.

On September 7, 2020 we celebrate 129 years of Ukrainian settlement in Alberta! What an achievement! Ukrainians have called Canada home – and have brought knowledge, expertise, experiences to so many levels of the cultural, political, social and economic life of our country.

UCC-APC celebrated Ukrainian-Canadian Heritage Day in Alberta with the auto-rally and the raising of the Ukrainian flag. Minister of Culture, Multiculturalism and Status of Women, Hon. Leela Sharon Aheer brought greetings from the Government of Alberta. Consul General of Ukraine in Edmonton, Oleksandr Danyleiko welcomed the visitors with a special "pryvit" from Ukraine. Our UCC-APC President Orysia Boychuk thanked the community for sharing the celebration today. MLA for Fort-Saskatchewan and Vegreville, Jackie Armstrong-Homeniuk shared her personal family story of what that meant to be raised in the Ukrainian family.



We look forward to celebrating 130th anniversary in 2021.

Hetman Awards

This year's Hetman Awards was held differently. In response to the pandemic the decision was made to not host an annual banquet. The recipients received their awards in a private setting (limiting the number of people in the same room) and combination of various interviews and videos made up an outstanding Hetman Awards Show that premiered online on October 24, 2020.

We had an opportunity to witness Marko Levytsky receive a Cross of Ivan Mazepa from his Excellency Andriy Shevchennko, Ambassador of Ukraine to Canada. We also welcomed a special guest and key-note speaker Consul General Oleksandr Danyleiko.

UCC - Calgary Branch

Past year between October 2019 - October 2020 marks an important transition period for UCC Calgary. On October 10th, the UCC Calgary Interim Steering Committee was established to oversee the transition process and operations. UCC Calgary became incorporated as a society in the Province of Alberta under the Societies Act on February 19, 2020. On March 4, 2020 UCC Calgary held an organizational meeting to discuss next steps for implementing the approved bylaws. Due to COVID-19 lockdown, the full transition to a new governance structure under the bylaws to ensure a wide representation of our community organizations in the new Board and Executive, and thus in UCC Calgary operations and its strategic development, has been moved to Fall 2020. The first AGM is now scheduled for December 2nd, 2020. In addition to this important organizational work. UCC Calgary led a number of key events in our community during past 12 months:

• UCC Calgary organized the Holodomor commemoration 2019, which featured Premier Kenney as a keynote speaker and raised \$450 in cash donations and 110 lb of food for the Calgary Food Bank.

• Together with support from UCPBA Calgary, Echoes of Ukraine, St. Vlad's, UCC Calgary coorganized the XXIII Calgary Annual Ukrainian Carol Festival hosted by the St. Vladimir's Ukrainian Orthodox Sobor.

• UCC Calgary in partnership with the League of Ukrainian Canadian Women, Calgary Branch and the Immigrant Services Calgary organized a free information session about ISC Language Assessment Centre (ILVARC) government-funded programs for newcomers.

• UCC Calgary led the Annual Shevchenko Concert, which was held on March 9, 2020. The concert took place at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Ukrainian Catholic Church Hall and was a great success.





 UCC Calgary mobilized the community to join #VyshyvankaCanada2020 and the Canada-wide virtual map.

 In June 2020, UCC Calgary organized the virtual fundraiser for the Calgary Food Bank dedicated to commemoration of Internment 100: "Remember Canada WWI Internment. Пам'ятаємо. Допомагаємо". An incredible \$2,490 was raised to provide much needed food on a table of many Calgarians in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

• UCC Calgary organized by invite only ceremony on August 12, 2020 to mark the 25th anniversary of the placement of the Castle Mountain Internment statue and bronze plaque in the Banff National Park.

Alberta Foundation for Ukrainian Education Society "supports the development of Ukrainian language education in order to foster and promote positive social and cultural identity within Canada's diverse mosaic." This was a very busy year for AFUES and during this time, our organization has continued making strong strides in fulfilling our mission.

At our 2020 AGM, we elected the following AFUES Board: President – Vlodko Boychuk, Vice-President – Semen Kostiuk, Treasurer – Ihor Krys, Secretary – Nataliya Nayavko, Past President - Marco Levytsky, Directors - Olena Hartsula (Membership Portfolio) and Alla Nedashkivska (Scholarships Portfolio), Member-at-Large - Ilija Simcisin.

Some of AFUES accomplishments during 2019-2020 reporting period include:

1. This year AFUES has funded different areas of Ukrainian language education: from Saturday Heritage Schools, such as Ridna Shkola and Kursy Ukrayinoznavstva to Ukrainian Bilingual Programs and post-secondary Ukrainian education.

2. AFUES continued providing Ukrainian Language Scholarships for the University of Alberta undergraduate Ukrainian language courses.

3. Just like we do it every year, AFUES was a co-sponsor of the 2020 Annual Shevchenko Lecture with Senator Raynell Andreychuk.

4. AFUES representatives had a meeting with Bishop David Motiuk and his Religious Education team, who provided us with positive feedback about our latest Ukrainian Religion resources for Gr. 1 Ukrainian Bilingual students. As you know, a number of year ago AFUES commissioned Ukrainian language developers from Ukrainian Catholic University (UCU) who used Alberta Program of Studies for teaching Religion in Ukrainian, and developed modern, digital and attractive materials for Gr. 1 Ukrainian Bilingual students.

5. Due to lack of funds and interest in using these as primary learning resources, AF-UES has made a decision not to continue working on this Ukrainian language project. Now interested parties can obtain it directly from the School of Ukrainian Language and Culture at Ukrainian Catholic University.

6. Our organization successfully hosted AFUES Casino in October, 2020. Thank you to many of our members and supporters for donating their time and expertise to run this successful fundraising event. Special thank you to Olena Hartsula for coordinating volunteers for this casino.

COVID Response: The impacts of COVID were felt across all our member organizations, as dance schools and ensembles were forced to cancel lessons, workshops, concerts, tours, and fundraising activities. As some schools have returned

to offering lessons with social distancing measures in place, the complete impact of COVID is still unknown. Many families have chosen to isolate their families at home and not register for this dance year.

As part of our commitment to be responsive to the changing needs of the Ukrainian Dance community, AUDA took the following measures to adapt our programming:

- New AUDA Summer Digital Workshop Program was developed, committing to provide up to 20 member organizations, \$150 per organization to support online options for dance camps and dance workshops over the summer months.
- A special summer intake of our AUDA Community Ukrainian Dance Workshop Program was announced, offering an honorarium of \$1000 in return for member organizations to organize and host workshops
- The maximum level of support for the AUDA Promotional Activities program was increased from \$450 per group this dance season to \$900 per group

In addition to the program changes, AUDA also hosted ZOOM conferences with member instructors and organizations to discuss and share best practices in online instruction and dance school reopening.

AUDA Instructor Volyn Masterclass: In association with Ukrainian Dance Instructor Conference (UDIC), AUDA presented an Instructors Volyn Masterclass on November 15 and 16, 2019 at the Tryzub studios in Calgary. Yaroslav Smyrnov from Lutsk, Ukraine presented on the ethnography, costuming, and lexicon from the Volyn region of Ukraine. 24 Instructors participated from Alberta, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Utah USA.

New Digital Workshop Program: 3 workshops



were supported over the summer to approximately 60 participants. July 6 to 10 – Shumka for Me

July 13 to August 21 – Cheremosh Summer Camps August 10 to September 3 – Regions of Ukraine presented by Vykrutas

Music Resources: Beginning in 2016, AUDA undertook an initiative to source newly recorded Ukrainian heritage folk dance music as a resource for dance schools from composers in both Canada and Ukraine. AUDA added an additional 6 pieces this last year, for a total of 62 newly recorded music pieces posted on our website and available for free download by our membership.

Promotional Activities: AUDA supported 35 Ukrainian dance performances by 11 different groups at community events to an estimated audience of nearly 30,000 people as part of the AUDA Promotional Activities Initiative to Increase Participation and Awareness of Ukrainian Dance in Alberta – Celebrating 125 Years of Ukrainian Immigration.

NEW AUDA Internment Commemoration Initiative: To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of Canada's first national internment operations, AUDA is pleased to undertake a 2-year commitment to provide a total of 5 community development incentives, up to a maximum amount of \$1,000 each, to our member Ukrainian Dance Schools and Dance Groups in Alberta to support Internment Commemoration new dance works, dance work revivals, cultural, and community awareness projects.

Our current organization members of AUSRL are comprised of Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada – Alberta Provincial (UWAC-ABE), Canadian Ukrainian Youth Association-Ukrainian Orthodox Youth (CYMK-UOY Alberta), Ukrainian Self-Reliance Association (TYC) Edmonton / Calgary, Ukrainian Museum of Canada – Alberta Branch, and St. John's Institute. One key component of AUSRL mandate is to recognise students in post-secondary studies and their leadership contributions to CYMK-UOY in Alberta. This year with COVID-19 Restriction, we have not met since June, 2020 to set our AGM 2020 date.

Our funding supports for the 2019-2020 year have extended to Camp Bar-V-Nok Summer Program, Ukrainian Museum of Canada – Alberta Branch, Alberta Provincial CYMK-UOY, Western Eparchy of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada, St. Nicholas Ukrainian Orthodox Parish, Red Deer, and St. John's Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral, Edmonton (towards purchase of a video streaming equipment for livestreaming liturgies) We are able to support the programs within Alberta through our casino funds raised by our community.

As President of AUSRL, I have been active in the CYC –National Board, being one of the provincial CYC representatives, as well as the Vice President on our National USRL-CYC Board. Throughout the year I have participate in almost all CYC-NEC Conference Calls, convened on a monthly basis. At our 2019 USRL-CYC National Biennial Convention, a new structure for our National Organization was passed, which essentially eliminated the Men's Association, USRA-TYC at the National and Provincial level. These USRA-TYC branches are now part of branches of USRL-CYS across the country. This CYC Restructuring, looked at streamlining our organizations to better meet the community needs. At the provincial level AUSRL is a member of Alberta Ukrainian Canadian Congress and have participated in provincial meetings and the AGM. As with many of our Ukrainian community organizations, we are looking at ways to support our community during these COVID-19 restrictions on gatherings, but still to allow programming to continue within our greater Ukrainian Canadian community. Our main fundraiser, our AGLC Casino

was postponed from June, 2020 to November 4-5, 2020, due to these COVID-19 restrictions. Thank you to our community volunteers for their support of this fundraiser activity.

Our 2020 Annual General Meeting will occur prior to December 31, 2020 so we can hold this meeting, establish our operating board, and recognize our 2020 CYMK-Ukrainian Orthodox Youth Leadership Bursary recipients. With the sale of St. John's Institute on Whyte Avenue this past summer, we have moved our mailing address to an Edmonton Postal Office Box, to

allow us to receive mail uninterrupted. Since March, 2020 meetings have been held virtually using the National USRL-CYC Google for Non-Profits MEET account.

For over 45 years the Edmonton Catholic Schools Ukrainian Bilingual Program remains strong. Enrollment (K-Gr. 12) For the 2019-2020 year...630 students (St. Matthew -196; St. Martin – 244; St. Brendan – 115; Austin O'Brien-75).

Highlights of 2019-20 and events sponsored by Edmonton Catholic Schools Ukrainian Bilingual Parent Advisory Society (UBPAS): AGM, Scholarship Presentation and Appreciation Evening (October 3, 2019): -Presentations included scholarships to recipients in Grades 4-12...over 30 awards were given out in several categories. Special presentation was made to Daria Porochinywk, high school teacher in the UBP at AOB, retiring after 35 years with the program...this in itself was a VERY BIG milestone, of the Ukrainian Bilingual program.

When the program was extended to high school at AOB, she was the first high school teacher to teach in the UBP.

- We also held our AGM and elections for a new Board of Directors, with Marian Butz-Gauk, continuing as President of UBPAS
- November 2019: Ukrainian picture dictionaries were presented to Grade 2 students at St. Martin and at St. Matthew.

***Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a number of farewell physical events were cancelled, with included the annual Grade 12 Matura. The Grade 6 farewells for both St. Martin and St. Matthew were celebrated with a virtual event in June 2020, which included an online liturgy and a pre-recorded video message to the Grade 6 students from Marian Butz-Gauk on behalf of UBPAS.

<u>Marketing and Advertising 2019-2020:</u> Marketing and advertising for the Edmonton Catholic Schools Ukrainian Bilingual Program continued to be a joint venture with the UBPAS, the school administrations, and Edmonton Catholic School District. The marketing plan included the following initiatives, all coordinated by ECSD, and funded jointly by the Ukrainian Bilingual Parent Advisory Society and our partner organization, UBLA (Ukrainian Bilingual Language Association):

1918: St. John's Institute opens its doors to 35 student residents as Mykhailo Hrushevsky Ukrainian Institute in a rented space in downtown Edmonton.

1919: Amalgamates with Taras Shevchenko Institute in Vegreville and purchases two buildings on 98 St. & 106 Ave.

1949: Purchases building on 82 Ave., in the University of Alberta neighbourhood. Renames the Institute after its patron St. John Chrysostom, a 4th C. philosopher and Archbishop of Constantinople.

1958: Cornerstone of new building blessed by Most Reverend Metropolitan Ilarion.

1960: New wing of SJI opened, with residence capacity of 75 students, apartment for rectors, dining hall, library, and chapel.

2009: Closed for interior renovation and addition of two stories.

2011: Reopened to residents, students and others, as an affordable housing initiative.

2020: SJI building and land at 11024-82 Ave. sold to Alignvest; two empty lots on 83rd Ave. sold to the City of Edmonton.

And so, St. John's Institute is looking forward to a new phase in its 102-year history. SJI continues to own property on Pigeon Lake, known as Camp Bar-V-Nok, and supports the work of the Bar-V-Nok Society which manages the Retreat & Conference Centre. Also, profits from the sale of property will benefit the St. John's Institute Foundation, which will continue to develop and support Ukrainian educational projects in the spirit of Orthodoxy.

Ukrainian Canadian Social Services

UCSS objects:

To provide assistance and moral support to the needy community members in problems not covered by existing social services.

During the reported period UCSS has continued to provide its services to the community. Our office has been opened to the public and served needy community members that required help not available at main stream organizations. The services were available to all community members and have not been based on membership. All provided services were free of charge. UCSS services are confidential and client's personal information are not provided to other institutions. The office staff worked under the management and directions of the Board of Directors.

Immigration/Settlement:

The office continued to work on immigration and settlement programs and during the reported period dealt mostly with temporary foreign workers and their families, who have already been in Canada for several years. The majority of them finalized their immigration processes and now they are entitled to apply for various governmental programs for newcomers and Canadian citizenship. A number of temporary residents was in the final stage of their immigration processes and they needed some assistance with their applications. Due to the economic downturn Alberta acconted, significantly loss temporary workers. It had a huge impact on the Alberta accepted significantly less temporary workers. It had a huge impact on the number of temporary workers and prospective immigrants from Ukraine and other Eastern European countries to Alberta.

The office staff helped the clients with the following inquiries: work permit extension, visitor and entry visa for family members, sponsorship processes (mostly family/ spousal/parental sponsorship), renewal of Permanent Resident Cards, applying for Canadian Citizenship, providing general information about immigration regulations and possible ways to immigrate to Canada.

Community:

Community services included assistance with: child tax benefits applications, applying for senior benefits – Canadian Pension Plan, Old Age Security Pension, Provincial Senior Benefits, City Property Tax, housing for seniors, Commissioner for Oaths service (invitations for a visit, certification of signatures and true copies, declarations), translation and interpretation services, Employment Insurance applications, information on Alberta Labour Standard and complain process, information on family issues (sickness, divorce, child custody, social assistance, etc). Provincial social workers were aware about our agency and they contacted the office if there was a need for community support.

This past summer, a Community Emergency Relief Account was established to provide assistance for our clients' food and medical prescription needs. In addition, through working with UCC-APC, we supported Food Bank drives for rural communities.

Pomich Ukraini : The "Food Banks" in Ukraine (Blahodiyne Kharchuvannia) is the project that has been conducted by the UCSS National Office in cooperation with UCSS Branches and Social Service of Ukraine. In 2019 our Branch donated \$3000 to the project.

The office staff worked with volunteers (bingo, building maintenance, distributing fundraising envelopes). Our volunteers were mostly those, who retired from their professional life and were willing to help the community.

Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre (URDC), MacEwan University

The Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre (URDC), an endowed Centre at MacEwan University, stays true to its legacy of being engaged with the Ukrainian Canadian community as well as identifying, carries out, and contributing to educational and cultural projects that connect the University with its partners in Canada and Ukraine.

Main initiatives in 2019 include the three education abroad opportunities that took students from three Faculties to Ukraine. The Global Health Perspectives course, offered via the Faculty of Nursing, is part of the reciprocal exchange with the Ternopil National Medical University. The Sociology Field School students investigated the issues of youth at risk in Canada and Ukraine – they spent two weeks in Lviv, visiting government and community organizations and working with students and faculty from the Ukrainian Catholic University.

The Community Service-Learning course provided transformative opportunities for students who worked, along other North American and Ukrainian volunteers, in the summer camp for disadvantaged children in Vorokhta, Western Ukraine. Also, Memorandum of Understanding has been signed with the Lviv National Music Academy that will open doors for innovative initiatives in the area of music in the upcoming years. Another major project initiated this year is the Canada Ukraine Model United Nations, which brings together young people from the National University Kyiv Mohyla Academy, Ukrainian Catholic University and MacEwan.

Students participated in several international video conferences, face-to-face training in Kyiv, online trainings, and will jointly participate in the National Model United Nations conferences – UN simulations – in Erfurt, Germany in November 2019 and New York, USA in March 2020. This will be the first representation by a Ukrainian delegation at the National Model United Nations international conference for Ukraine.
