President's Message | Від голови

The work of Ukrainian Canadian Congress - Alberta Provincial Council has continued to support the settlement of newcomers fleeing the tragic war perpetrated by the russian. Alberta has received more than 40,000 evacuees making it the second largest receiving province next to Ontario. Continued advocacy and collaboration with Ukrainian organizations, governments and settlement agencies has been part of the success.

Від початку повномасштабного вторгнення Росії в Україну, Конґрес Українців Канади продовжує активно підтримувати новоприбулих українців. Ми провадимо більшу частину роботи з врегулювання адаптаційних проблем новоприбулих, розпочатої у 2022 році. Меблевий склад досі користується великою популярністю серед новоприбулих та донорів, його вартість оцінюється в 5 000 000 доларів. Програма "Зустріч в аеропорту" все ще діє, щоб допомогти тим, хто щойно ступив на канадську землю. У Калґарі та Едмонтоні було зроблено акцент на курси англійської мови, щоб допомогти швидше інтегруватись в англомовне середовище та працевлаштуватись. Кілька успішних грантових заявок допомогли підтримати ці ініціативи в різних частинах провінції. Ярмарки вакансій також є важливими і часто збирають 1000 людей на зустрічі з роботодавцями. Збір коштів для підтримки новоприбулих подарунковими картками та для українських організацій, які пропонують програми, був важливим і успішним.

UCC-APC has also hosted information sessions on topics that are important to newcomers such as an overview of laws in Canada provided by the Edmonton Police Service and a separate session about permanent residency. A special session on permanent residency was held for the Deaf Community which was well received.

While the challenges of the war continue, we hosted our annual events and promoted activities that are uplifting to the community. The golf tournament hosted at Kananaskis was a great success and provided many networking opportunities. This year's Ukrainian Day, held on August 20 at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village and was highly successful with approximately 2900 people in attendance. UCC-APC coordinate and was present for important milestones such Ukraine Independence, Flag Day, Holodomor Memorial Day and National Internment Day.

This year also presented some unique opportunities. Yuliya Kovaliv, the Ambassador from Ukraine to Canada, visited Edmonton and Calgary at the end of June. UCC-APC hosted a dinner with the Ukrainian Community leaders. Additionally, I was invited to travel to Ottawa to meet President Zelenskyy and hear his speech in parliament. President Zelenskyy mentioned Edmonton several times during his speech with a focus on being the first location in the world to erect a Holodomor monument. Also, we had an opportunity to meet a Prime Minister of Ukraine Denys Shmyhal and President of European Commission Ursula von der Leyen.

Our communities throughout Alberta and their fabulous volunteers continue to meet these challenges and continue to welcome Ukrainian newcomers and offer them a safe haven from the unjust war that they have endured. Thank you to the board, all our volunteers, donors and partner organizations for your steadfast support this past year. Also, a special thanks to our office staff. Without all of you the miracles that we were able to accomplish would not have.

UCC-APC 2022 – 2023 AGM Report

Community Outreach

We have been working in partnership with many organizations, agencies, businesses, and academic institutions this past year.

In January 2023, the Polish Canadian Congress in Alberta made a \$15,000 donation to UCC-APC to support Ukrainian Newcomers arriving to Alberta. Subsequently, in May 2023, the Polish Canadian Humanitarian Society under the leadership of Anthony Muszynski held a fundraising banquet and raised a total of \$50,000 for supporting Ukrainian settlement in Alberta. We are extremely grateful for the generosity of the Polish community.

UCC-APC attended many speaking engagements including being the keynote address at the Kyiv Konnection Banquet, presentation to the Nisku Rotary Club, University of Alberta CIUS (Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies) presentation at National Conference: Ukrainian Immigration to Canada: From Post Independence to Post War.

UCC-APC held a dinner meeting in June with Ambassador Yulia Kovaliv to discuss updates and priorities on her work and our work.

We have been participating in weekly and biweekly calls with local and provincial agencies that help support Ukrainian newcomers.

UCC-APC has formed partnerships with Ukrainian communities in Red Deer, Lethbridge, Lloydminster, Lakeland Region, Fort McMurray,























Fundraising Campaign

UCC-APC worked in partnership with the Calgary -Ukrainian Canadian Professional **Business** Association and held its annual Golf Tournament in Kananaskis on June 2023. With the generous support of our sponsors and the participants in the golf tournament, we raised \$19,482.68 to aid UCC-APC and the Calgary - Ukrainian Canadian Professional Business Association in providing and for Ukrainian programming supports newcomers arriving in Alberta. The tournament would not have been possible without the generous contributions, the volunteers that organized this tournament, and the incredible staff at the Kananaskis Golf Course.



Holodomor

November 21-27, 2022, was National Holodomor Commemoration Week. Holodomor Memorial Day occurs on the fourth Friday of November in schools as a Day of Remembrance. Ukrainians in Alberta are united with the international community in commemorating the anniversary of the 1932-33 Holodomor-Genocide in Ukraine. In Soviet Ukraine, the region known as Europe's breadbasket, 7- 10 million lives were suddenly eradicated by starvation at the hands of Joseph Stalin. Together we can spread the truth about the Holodomor and ensure acknowledgement of the Holodomor as an act of genocide against the Ukrainian nation.

Please take some time to learn and reflect during National Holodomor Commemoration Week, November 20-26, 2023, and join us at the Alberta Legislature on November 21, 2023, at 12:15 p.m. for a service of remembrance.

















Government Relations

UCC-APC has been meeting with elected officials on all levels of government advocating for the many needs of Ukrainian Newcomers. We have been successful in receiving post-secondary funds to support Ukrainian Newcomers to attend post-secondary institutions. We strongly advocated for the driver's license exchange program and were successful in achieving this. UCC-APC held a meeting with the mayor of Fort McMurray to discuss support for Ukrainian Newcomers and create employment pathways. The past year we held meetings with MP Randy Boissonnault, MP Heather McPherson, and numerous Provincial Ministers including McNally, Nicolaides, and Madu.

We also attended meetings held with special dignitaries such as Prime Minister of Ukraine Denys Shmyhal, meeting with Ursula Von der Leyen President of the European Commission and President of Ukraine Zelenskyy.









Hetman Awards

The Annual Hetman Awards recognizes significant volunteer achievements of outstanding Ukrainian Albertans and is dedicated to the celebration of all volunteers who have given their time, effort, and expertise to contributing to a strong, vibrant, and active Ukrainian Canadian community in Alberta. This year's Hetman Awards will be held on December 2, 2024. We are pleased to announce this year's recipients.

We will also be hosting a special recognition award for those who stepped up and performed extraordinary work to help with the settlement of Ukrainian newcomers to Alberta. The award is called the "Ukraine Crisis – Humanitarian Aid Award" and will be awarded at the Hetman Gala in 2023.











Internment

Under the War Measures Act between 1914 and 1920, 8,579 of Ukrainians were considered "enemy aliens" by Canada and unjustly imprisoned in concentration camps. During National Internment Commemoration Week, we remember thousands of Ukrainians that were unjustly interned and suffered in Canada. This year on October 1st an internment monument was unveiled at the Alberta Legislature grounds. This stands as a testament to the resilience, strength, and enduring spirit of the Ukrainian Canadians who endured a terrible injustice during World War I. The community came together to remember and honor those who suffered during one of the darkest chapters in our nation's history, the internment of Ukrainian Canadians.



Ukrainian Day

On August 20th, 2023, the Ukrainian Community in Alberta celebrated Ukrainian Day at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village. Our theme was "Opening Our Hearts." We focused on welcoming our newcomers to Alberta and we were greeted by 2,900 festival attendees. There was an extensive line up of local performers and newcomers with choirs,dancers and bands ensembles. We were honoured to present the Luchkovich Award to Derron Bilous for his dedication and service to the Ukrainian community while working as MLA between 2012 and 2023. Our very own Orysia Boychuk was honored with the Paul Harris Award by the Rotary Club for dedication in supporting Ukrainian Newcomers arriving in Alberta. During this event, the Polish Canadian Humanitarian Society presented a cheque for \$50,000 to UCC-APC to continue the ongoing efforts of settlement and humanitarian aid.















Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine

During the past year, UCC-APC donated \$10,000 dollars to Ukraine for the purchase of critically needed medical supplies. We have delivered \$5,000 to Charitable Foundation KOLO for the purchase of sterile surgical instruments for the Kyiv's Military Hospital. Additionally, we donated \$5,000 dollars to Zhytomyr's Military Hospital Surgery Department. There are hundreds of wounded soldiers that are being treated in Ukrainian hospitals daily. With our donations we were able to become a small part in the long road to recovery of a few Ukrainian wounded soldiers. More details about those donations had been posted on UCC-APC social media sites.







Settlement Supports

Website uccab.ca


We immediately created a bilingual website to address Settlement Supports for Ukrainian Newcomers - Information in both Ukrainian and English is available on many topics such as: financial assistance; accommodations; education; obtaining documents such as SIN, Driver's License, and Alberta Health Care Card; employment childcare, public transportation and more. This website also offers information to Albertans on how they can help with Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine; help with providing temporary housing to newcomers: donate clothing and furniture to help newcomers get settled; as well as donate money to support the UCC-APC efforts. We continue to update the website and maintain relevant information for Ukrainians in Alberta and Ukrainian newcomers.





English Classes

Being able to speak English is vital for Ukrainian newcomers to find employment and become self-sustaining, and the demand for classes is extremely high. UCC-APC is supporting the need for these English classes. Daytime intensive 2-week English survival classes are being held in Calgary. This year UCC-APC received funds from Calgary Learns to operate these classes for a one-year period. In Edmonton, we are hosting 2 English classes once a week online and in-person. We have also provided \$10,000 to URDC (Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre) MacEwan University to run pilot English class program for Ukrainian Newcomers.



· Welcome Booth at the airport

In the early weeks of war until June 2022, a "Welcome Booth" opened and operated at the Edmonton International Airport to greet and support Ukrainian newcomer. The Welcome Booth worked in partnership with Ukrainian National Federation and was run by volunteers. In March 2023, the "Welcome Booth" at the Edmonton airport received Canada Ukraine Foundation funding and reopened and was able to operate until August 2023. UCC-APC has reapplied for CUF funding to operate until March 2024, when the CUAET (Canada Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel) program will cease in effect.

Emergency Food to Hotels

The UCC-APC provided one meal per day to Ukrainian newcomers staying at the 25 IRCC (Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada) hotel rooms in Edmonton. We supported the hot meal program from December 2022 to April 2023 until the Government of Alberta took over the funding of food.





Job Fairs

UCC-APC has been hosting large scale job fairs to support survival employment for Ukrainian newcomers. One on-line job fair was held in the winter of 2022. Three in-person job fairs were held in Calgary and in Edmonton, averaging 700-1000 newcomer attendees with 25 - 28 employers offering employment opportunities. Ukrainian translators were available to assist attendees and employers at these events.





Furniture Warehouse

Ukrainian Newcomer Furniture Warehouses were established in both Calgary and Edmonton to help support newcomers settle in their new homes with mattresses, kitchen tables, couches, and dressers. The Calgary warehouse closed March 2023; Edmonton warehouse remains open since April 2022. *Currently, we help furnish approximately 400 families a month, with over 5 million dollars worth of donated furniture has been distributed.* We are grateful for the generous donation of warehouse space by the Boilermakers Lodge in Edmonton. They have been extremely gracious to provide us with access to 20,000 square feet to help us operate the facility.

· Welcome Events

UCC-APC has hosted 4 welcome events in Edmonton and has supported Calgary for Ukrainian newcomers. The events provided essential information to help with settlement, such as employment opportunities, English classes, banking information, school programs. etc. These events also provided an opportunity for newcomers to connect with each other.

Mental Health Support

Since the onset of the war UCC-APC established mental health resources and directory of supports for Ukrainian Newcomers that is accessible on our uccab.ca website. Recently, we received support from the Canada Ukraine Foundation, and we were able to establish a mental health peer support group program for newcomers in Calgary and Edmonton. Monthly sessions are about to begin and will run for a period of 6 months.





Financial Support for Our Ukrainian Community in Alberta

UCC-APC was identified as fiscal agent to disperse \$200,000 of Government of Alberta grants. We were very fortunate to receive and disperse funds to our internal organizations to continue their programs that have been so important to Ukrainian newcomers. These grants helped support organizations with summer camp fees, membership fees, and hosting welcome events.

Educational Information Sessions for Ukrainian Newcomers

UCC-APC has been hosting online sessions to support Ukrainian Newcomers including tax sessions, immigration processes and how to obtain your PR (Permanent Residency) status and information about the law and how to be safe. We are planning to host sessions on basic banking literacy, your rights as a tenant, employment rights and many more sessions.



Financial Support for Our Community in Alberta

UCC-APC was identified as fiscal agent by the GOA to disperse approximately \$200,000 to our own internal organizations as well as mainstream organizations to help support Ukrainian Newcomers. We have helped support organizations with summer camp fees, membership fees, and hosting welcome events and food security. Congratulation to our recepients!


Ukrainian Canadian Congress – Edmonton Branch

First off, I'd like to extend a huge "Thank you" to the volunteers of UCC Edmonton board. The last nineteen months have been challenging for everyone in our community.

There are a few items that are worth highlighting:

- 1) On November 26, 2022, UCC-Edmonton hosted the annual Holodomor Commemoration featuring keynote speaker Michael Bociurkiw. Michael is an Edmonton born, Ukraine based Journalist with excellent insights into the Russia's use of food as weapon both in 1932-33 and today.
- 2) In December UCC-Edmonton Vice President collaborated with Employees of local Marriot hotels to direct their toy drive donations to Ukrainian newcomer children at several Catholic and Orthodox parishes in Edmonton.
- 3) On February 24, 2023 UCC-Edmonton collaborated with UNYF(MYHO) and UCC-APC to organize a demonstration in honor of the 1-Year anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine.
- 4) In March, UCC-Edmonton along with the Ukrainian Music Society of Alberta hosted the Annual Shevchenko Concert at the Ukrainian Youth Unity Complex and raised \$4472 for LUC's Friends of Ukrainian Defence Forces Fund.
- 5) In April, UCC-Edmonton hosted a Webinar along with the CRA's community outreach office with nearly 100 attendees.
- 6) In May, UCC-Edmonton organized the annual Vyshyvanka Day March from MacEwan University to the legislature grounds, raising funds for Dr. Alex Pavlenko's project Save UA Lives.
- 7) This year's Heritage Festival was a great success at a new venue in Borden Park. Once again, an army of volunteers made this event possible. UCC-Edmonton wrote letters to the festival organizers as well as the Russian Heritage Cultural Development Association. UCC-Edmonton fielded numerous media requests regarding the Heritage Festival.
- 8) On August 27, 2022, UCC-Edmonton hosted Ukrainian Independence Day at the Ukrainian Youth Unity Complex. For the second year in a row, the event was a smash hit with over 500 people in attendance. UCC-Edmonton raised \$3700 to purchase a Mavic Drone for Ukraine. The performers were almost exclusively Newcomers, with some local performers as well. Special thank-you to Lilya Sukha for putting together a spectacular artistic program. Thank you to the volunteers from the League of Ukrainian Canadians for helping set up the hall. Finally thanks to Stawnichy's Mundare Sausage House for sponsoring the BBQ portion of the program.
- 9) UCC-Edmonton is in the midst of planning the Commemoration of the 90th anniversary of the Holodmor to be held at Edmonton city hall on November 25, 2023.

Ukrainian Canadian Congress - Calgary Branch

It has been a remarkable year for the Ukrainian Canadian Congress (UCC) - Calgary Branch as we reflect on the dynamic shifts that have transformed our community since the onset of the war in Ukraine. The influx of Ukrainian evacuees to Calgary has changed the landscape of our community, leading to an exponential growth that has compelled both UCC Calgary and our member organizations to adapt and respond effectively.

Throughout the year, we have continued our commitment to collaborate closely with member organizations and with representatives from all levels of government, advocating for the needs of our community and standing in solidarity with Ukraine. We have continued to host our annual events, such as the Internment Operations and Holodomor Commemorations, Ukrainian Canadian Heritage Day, and the Shevchenko Concert. We are proud to report several key initiatives and events that have shaped our year:

- The unveiling of a commemorative plaque at Ukrainian Pioneers Park to honor the memory of those affected by the World War I internment operations in Canada.
- UCC Calgary organized a rally to mark the one-year anniversary of russia's genocidal war against Ukraine. Over 1000 people, including government representatives, joined us for this significant event, hosted inside Calgary City Hall on February 24, 2023.
- Our annual Vyshyvanka Day March was a resounding success, with over 500 participants proudly donning traditional Ukrainian attire. The live Tryzub added a special touch to the event.
- We celebrated Ukrainian Independence Day with a flag raising ceremony at City Hall, a fundraising walk & run event, and the highly successful Ukrainian Day in the Park festival, which included two performance stages, community and children's pavilion, Ukrainian food, and more, attended by over 1750 individuals.
- We are delighted to welcome Anhelina Taran to our team as the UCC Calgary Official Correspondent. Her presence has been instrumental in engaging Ukrainian newcomers within our community, fostering connection and support.
- Our community members and Ukrainian newcomers have been organizing bi-weekly Rallies for Ukraine under the auspices of UCC Calgary. These gatherings continue to serve as a platform for solidarity and raising awareness about the ongoing situation in Ukraine.

AUDA strives to provide professional skill development to dance teachers of all ages. Our biggest event in this past year was our Instructors Workshop, held in Calgary Alberta, which had thirty nine participants aged seventeen and up from British Colombia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba,Ontario and Utah. The main focus was to develop choreography for ages five to fifteen, specifically from the region of Polissya. This was lead by two artistic directors from Regina Saskatchewan.

AUDA has also undertaken applications for our Music Initiative program in which we are funding the creation of ten new music pieces that will embrace multi regions of Ukraine.

Lastly, we contributed to the enjoyment of Ukrainian dance at two large festivals with our annual Unity Pryvit which centred around brand new choreography that was created by volunteer instructors who are members of our board. This year, the Pryvit brought dancers from Innisfree, Myrnam, Bonnyville, Cheremosh School of Dance, St. Paul, Stony Plain, Shumka School of Dance, Fort Saskatchewan, and Fort McMurry. This pieces was performed at both UFest in Edmonton and the 50th Pysanky Festival in Vegreville.

With the upcoming 40th-year anniversary of its existence, AUDA is looking forward to staying true to its mandate, widening its reach of programming, and attracting new members and fresh ideas to make the experience of Ukrainian dance not only more colourful and vibrant, but also broadly accessible by all who would like to be part of it.









Alberta Ukrainian Self-Reliance Leagaue (AUSRL)

The 2022 AUSRL Annual Convention / Annual General Meeting was held in-person on January 29, 2023 at St. John's Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral, Solarium following the Divine Liturgy. It consisted of 3 component organization participating – the Ukrainian Museum of Canada – Alberta Branch held its AGM, the UWAC – Alberta Executive held their AGM to share their Financial Report and the AUSRL AGM was held. As well, we recognised 3 Ukrainian Orthodox Youth with the 2022 CYMK-UOY Leadership Bursary.

The AUSRL Annual Meeting was held in-person, after a three online presence die to COVID meeting protocols restricting ability to hold larger gatherings. We were please to be able to sponsor the Fellowship Luncheon following the Divine Liturgy, to allow for more participation and attendance in our Ukrainian Orthodox community.

As with many of our Ukrainian community organizations beginning to restart programming, we looked at how to best support our community in their restarts. As well, with the Russian Invasion of Ukraine in February, 2022 much of our community support also led to providing support for Ukrainian Newcomers arriving to Canada. Our funding distribution centered on restarting many of our organizations, as well as supporting the Newcomer efforts.

A major focus of our AUSRL Board during 2022-23 was our AGLC Casino which took place in April, 2023 which provides our major fundraising support to help our community organizations meet their cultural. education, and religious programming within Alberta. A huge thanks to Vivianne Kruhlak, who was our Casino Chairperson, working to fill the many volunteer positions to allow for this event to occur for AUSRL. We received \$ 77,877.94 from the Edmonton Casino Pooling for Quarter 2 (April-June, 2023)

Founded in 1941 by the first wave of Ukrainian settlers in Alberta, the mission of the Ukrainian Pioneers Association of Alberta (UPAA) is to preserve and promote Ukrainian-Albertan history and culture through public programming and through partnerships with and grants to other organizations.

The Ukrainian Pioneers Association of Alberta (UPAA) began this year with a very successful casino, followed by a volunteer appreciation event where we attended the University of Alberta Golden Bears vs. Ukraine hockey game.

Our major activity of the summer was a partnership with the Friends of the Ukrainian Village Society to co-host a Launch Party on July 14th preceding the Ukrainian Village Music Festival later that week. This was a successful event bringing in many attendees to dance to the band Steppe at the Stanhope Eatery and Bar.

We also continued to ship donated Ukrainian-language books from Alberta to interested libraries in Ukraine and elsewhere under the banner of "Project Prosvita". Several loads were sent this year despite the continuing wartime challenges.

We continued to be present in the community and set representatives to the supper with Ukraine's ambassador to Canada in Edmonton where we networked with many other Ukrainian organizations, and to the Ukrainian Indigenous Relationship Building Initiative's supper and dance at Métis Crossing, near Smoky Lake. As well, as part of our development of the board, the president attended the "Role of the Board Chair" webinar from Alberta Community Development and the "Interpretive Planning for Historic Sites" webinar from the Texas Historical Commission with the hope that this will allow us to hold effective strategic planning meetings next year where we can discuss the best role our historic society can take in the future, whether that be as primarily a host of events, a publisher of content, a provider of funding, or something else.

In the meantime, the board met and adjudicated several requests for funding from other organizations. Most of these were found to be in line with our mission of preserving and promoting Ukrainian-Albertan history or culture or they addressed grave humanitarian needs in Ukraine, and were therefore approved by the board. Letters to the successful applicants are still going out. So far, we have been able to let several groups know that they have been successful in their bids for funding, including:

- Dr. Mark Minenko, for ongoing archival research into internment
- Rotary Club Kyiv International, for the building shelters for internally displaced people in Ukraine
- · DobroDIY UKRAINE, for delivering meals to the Zaporizhzhya Regional Clinical Children's Hospital

More successful applicants will be contacted in the coming weeks!

In order to be able to create more of our own programs and fund more projects like those listed above in the future, the board is now involved in discussions to create new committees and policies, including a finance committee that will look for ways to invest our funds, an outreach committee that will look for volunteers and plan events, and a strategy committee that will revisit our bylaws, mission, and goals.

Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre (URDC) at MacEwan University

The Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre (URDC) at MacEwan University continued to be a focal point and a hub for promoting Ukrainian culture, education, and community engagement in 2023. We continue to hold Ukraine at MacEwan during these most challenging times of the Russian imperial war against Ukraine.

URDC's accomplishments, initiatives, and contributions range from academic programs and research to community engagement, panel discussions, exhibits and more. We work closely with students, faculty, staff and the Ukrainian Canadian community to keep awareness and deepen knowledge about Ukraine. This year, we introduced the first Ukraine week at MacEwan. *Ukraïna: From Adversity to Inspiration* featured an exhibit, a concert, a film screening, a lecture and the launch of the *Imagine Ukraine* podcast, all geared towards helping people find out about what drives Ukrainians in their fight for democracy in Europe.

URDC is honoured to be able to support Ukrainian students and academics by offering awards and visiting scholar grants. We continue working closely with our partner universities in Ukraine: National University of Kyiv Mohyla Academy, Ukrainian Catholic University, Ternopil National Medical University, and Lviv Music Academy. Dr. Gayana Yuksel, Dr. Yuliya Krylova-Grek, Dr. Svitlana Danchak, Dr. Lyudmyla Mazur are among the Ukrainian scholars who visited MacEwan and shared their knowledge and stories of Ukraine, from Crimean Tatars to hate speech and teaching in the times of war. URDC and MacEwan students held fundraisers for Ukraine. It was a pleasure to introduce MacEwan students and Alberta audiences to the talents of the ShockolaD jazz group. Such events foster true academic and cultural exchange. With the financial support from UCC-APC and UFCE, we organized the English Language classes for newcomers at MacEwan. Furthermore, the big two-day Indigenous Ukrainian Relations Initiative event showcased the power of open minds and compassion. The Canada Ukraine Model United Nations is in its fourth year of success. The Gene Zwozdesky Artist in Residence program is being launched this year, and Slinko with the *Motherless Nation* project is the inaugural artist.

The Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre at MacEwan University remained a dynamic hub of activity in 2023, contributing to the university's academic, cultural, and community life and beyond. We are committed to continue holding Ukraine here, in Canada.
